In Dartford, we're proud to be a diverse, enterprising and hard-working Borough – a place where businesses can start and grow and where there are opportunities for everyone to progress in work.

We're at the early stages of preparing a new Economic Development Strategy for Dartford. Looking ahead to the next five years, this will set out how we can help to grow the local economy, working together with business and with other parts of government.

Where we are now

Dartford is a growing Borough. In the last twenty years, our population has seen one of the fastest rates of growth in the country, and we're still growing. We're working hard to support this growth.

We have a very strong record on job creation. Over the past twenty years, jobs growth has been faster than population growth – and although many Dartford residents commute to London and elsewhere, lots of people from outside Dartford travel to the Borough for work.

We're also home to some 5,600 businesses, most of them small and working in a diverse range of sectors. Over the past decade, our business stock has grown at double the national rate, and our 'productivity' (the amount of output generated for every person in work) is higher than the UK average.

Why we're developing a new strategy

So in many ways, we're a high-performing Borough: a dynamic place, where people want to live and where business is expanding.

But we know that our economy is often held back, by transport congestion and infrastructure constraints, and by firms' ability to access the skills they need. We also know that the 'bigger picture' for the economy is changing rapidly: structurally, we're adapting to the the transition to a lower-carbon energy mix, the new opportunities of digitalisation, and changes in working patterns



and people's expectations of work. We are also an increasingly diverse Borough, and we are outward facing to the opportunities of the Thames Estuary and the wider South East. Looking to the future, we want to ensure that Dartford is ready for the challenge, so we continue to be Kent's most industrious, most enterprising Borough – and that the benefits of this support our whole community.

Our focus

Responding to these areas of opportunity and challenge, our Economic Development Strategy will focus on what the Council and its partners will do to support responsible economic growth, recognising that good jobs and good business opportunities will help make Dartford a place where everyone can thrive.

Our current thinking is focused on four themes:

Creating opportunities to access and progress in work	Ensuring that businesses can access the skills and talent they need by:
	 Increasing participation in 'work-based' learning (such as apprenticeships, traineeships, etc.)
	• Helping businesses help people to progress in the workplace
Overcoming infrastructure barriers to growth	Removing some of the constraints that hold back sustainable growth, by:
	• Securing investment in local transport and environmental infrastructure
	• Making the case for major regional and national projects that will benefit Dartford in the longer term
