AREA PROFILE

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INTRODUCTION

This profile summarises a range of population data for the wards of Greenhithe & Knockhall and Swanscombe in Dartford Borough. Both wards are represented by Swanscombe and Greenhithe Town Council.

As the ward boundaries changed in 2019, direct comparisons to earlier time periods should not be made.

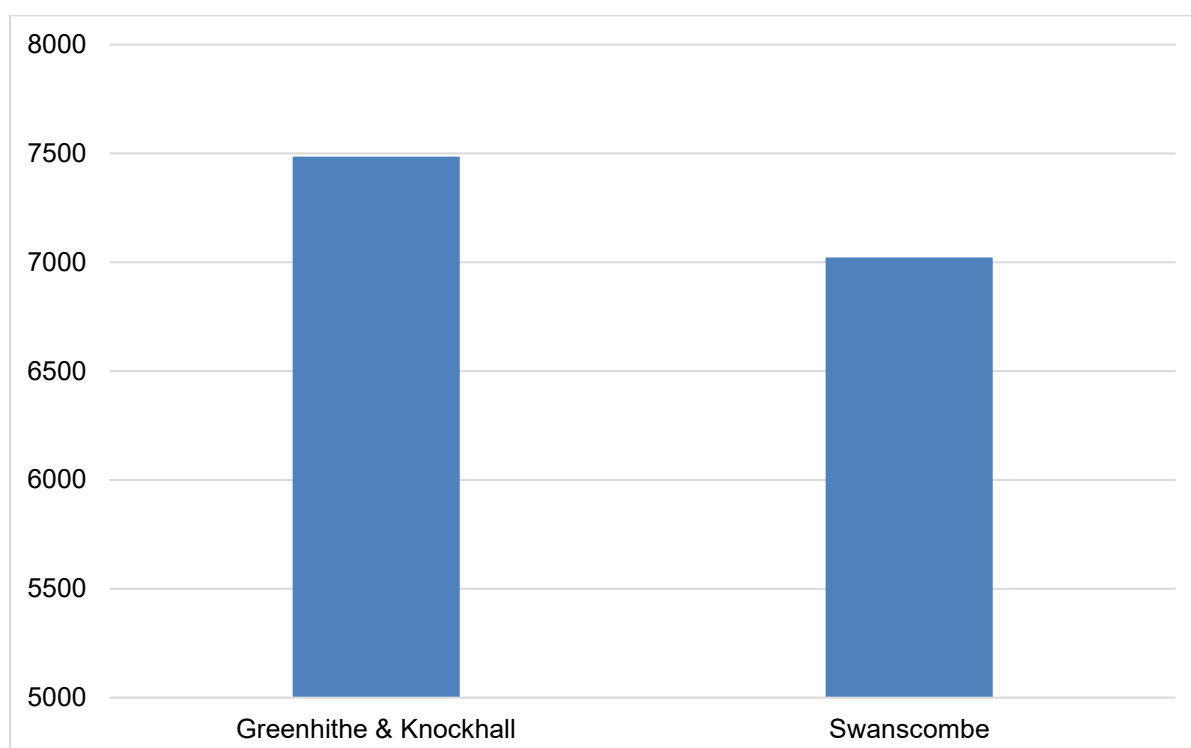
SUMMARY

- Greenhithe & Swanscombe has an above average young population, with 71.3% of the population under 50 years old.
- Population density is higher than the Borough average at 34 persons per hectare compared to 16 persons per hectare in Dartford overall.
- The rate of unemployment is higher than the Borough average of 3.1%, sitting at 4.1% in Greenhithe & Swanscombe.
- Terraced properties are most common, representing 39.5% of the housing stock, with purpose-built flats making up 27.8% and semi-detached properties are 21.7%. Overall, 57% of dwellings are owner occupied.
- Almost 18% of households in Greenhithe & Swanscombe do not own a car or van.

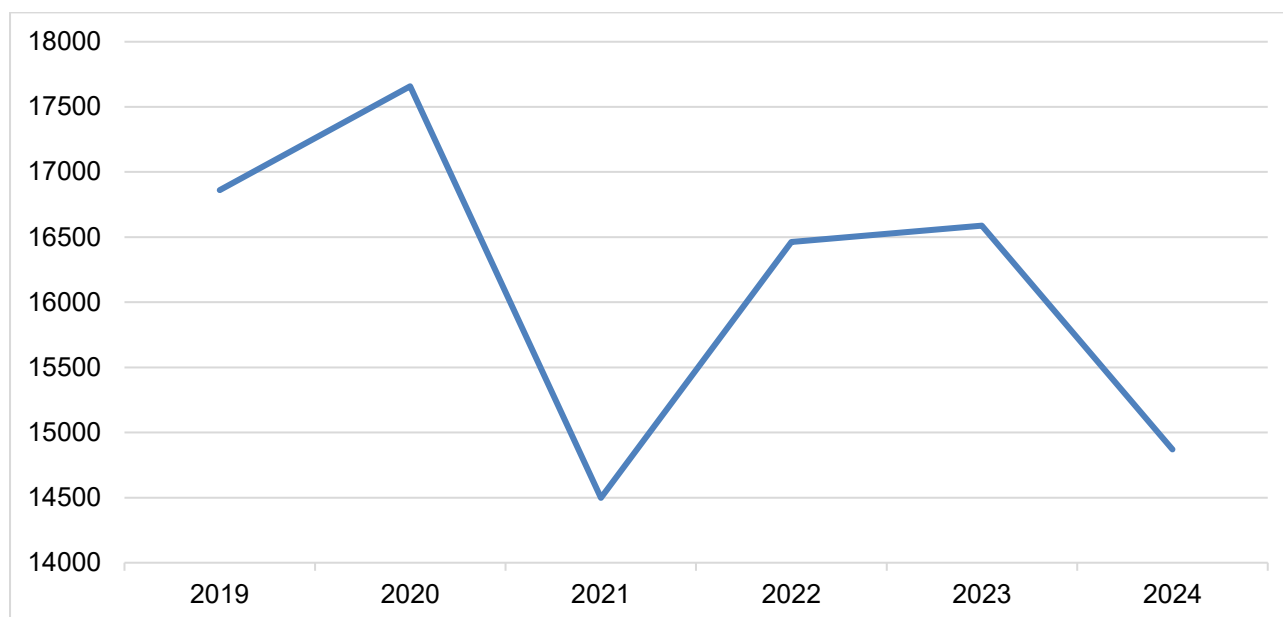
POPULATION

In 2021, Greenhithe & Swanscombe had a population of 14,507 people. This comprised of 7,153 males and 7,354 females, representing a 49.3% and 50.7% split respectively.

Chart 1: Population by ward within Greenhithe & Swanscombe, 2021

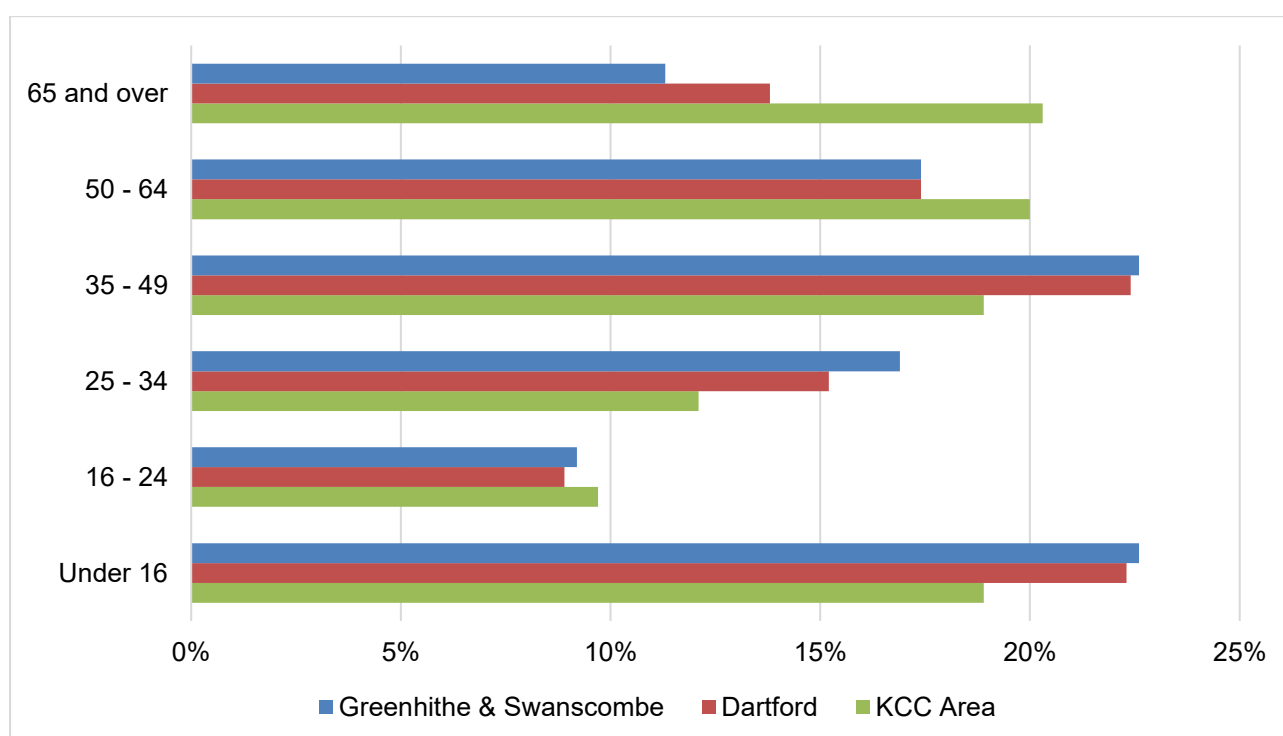

POPULATION DENSITY

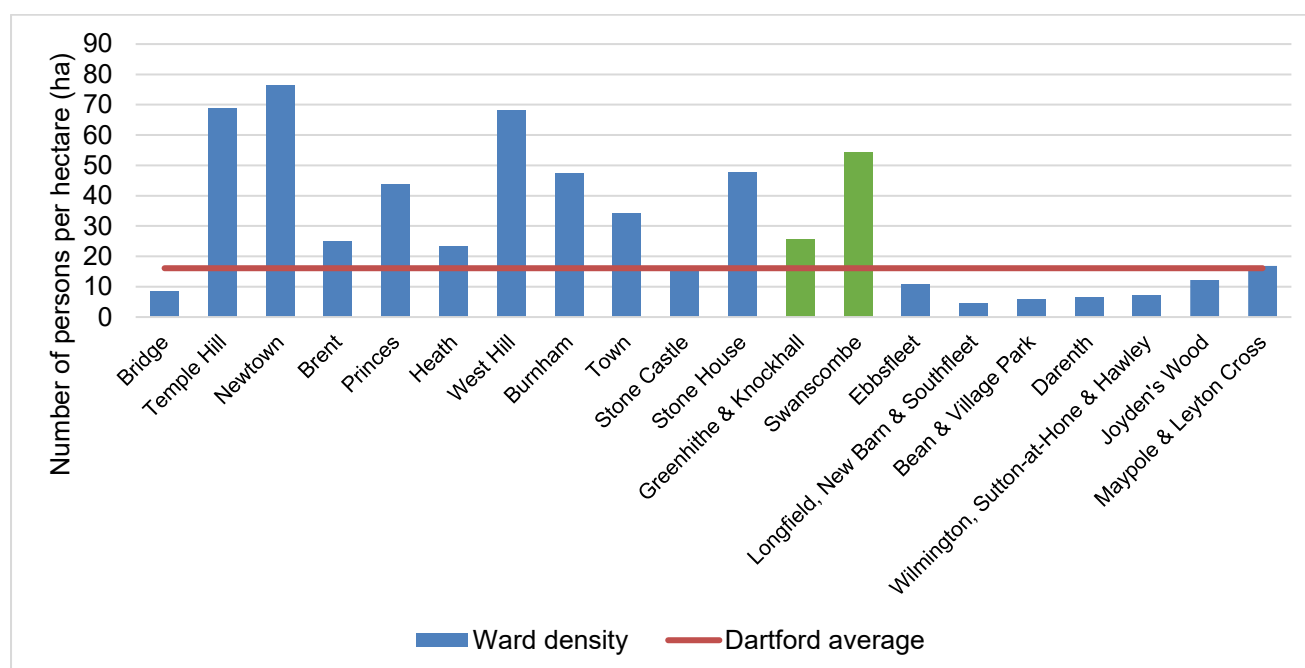
Greenhithe & Swanscombe has a population density of 34.3 persons per hectare, compared to the Borough average of 16.1 persons per hectare.

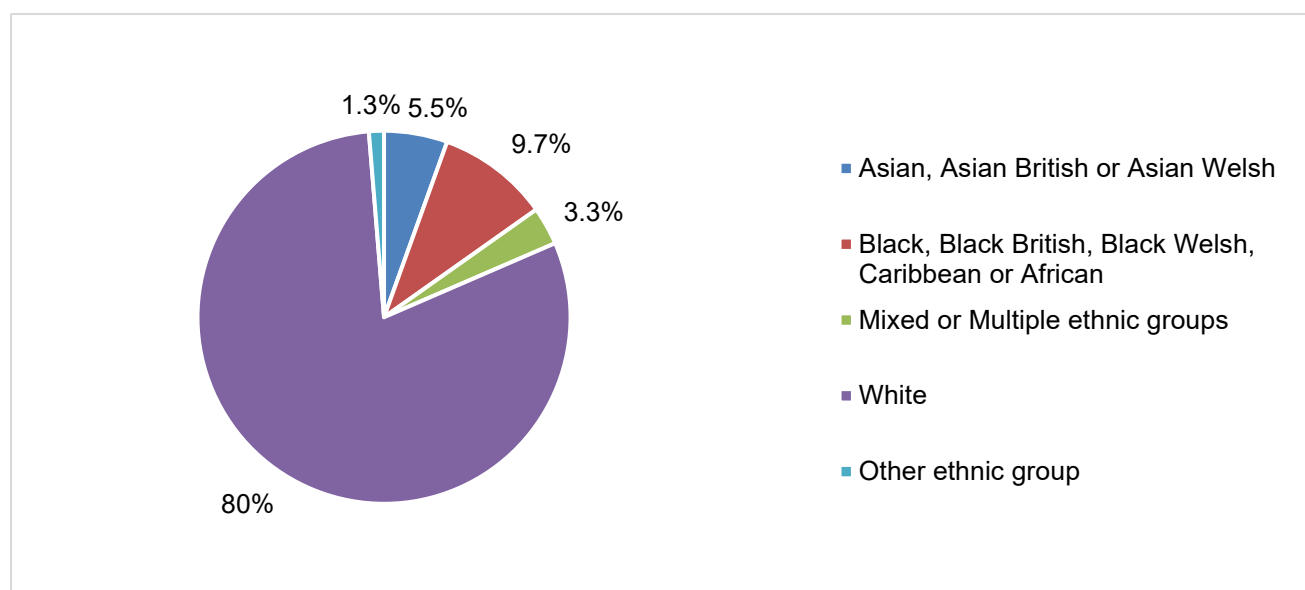

Chart 4: Population density by ward, 2021

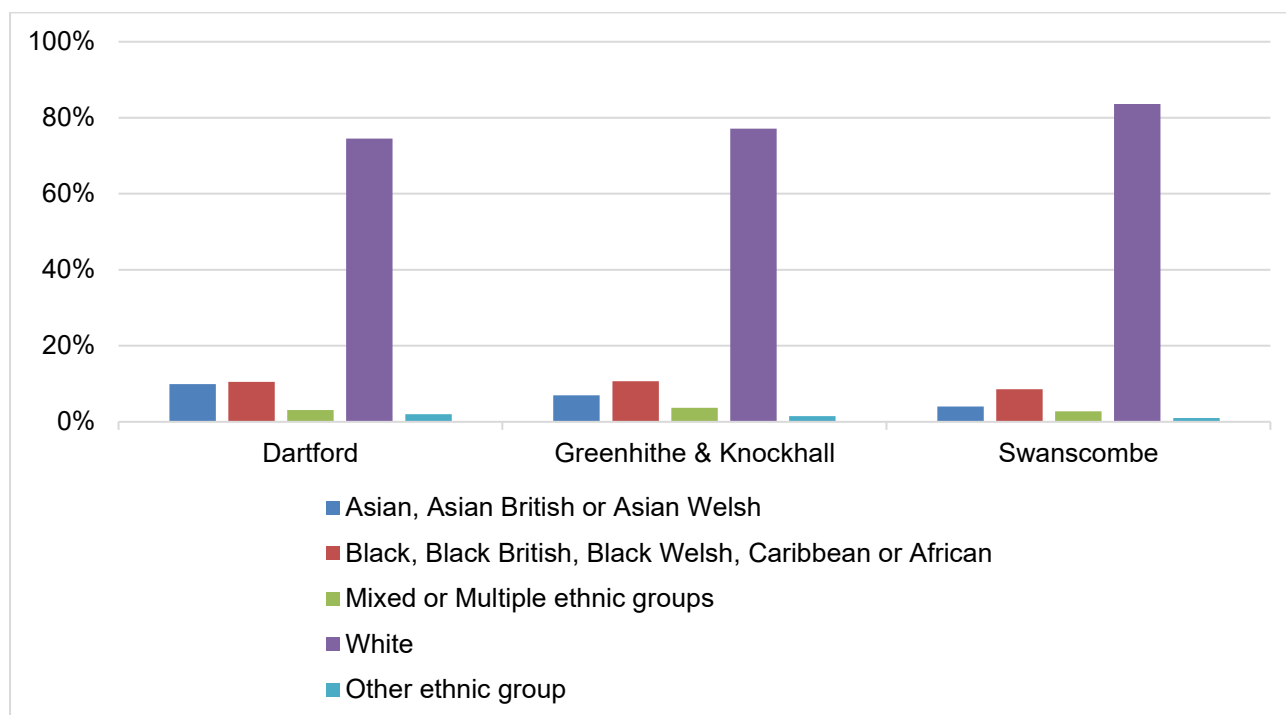

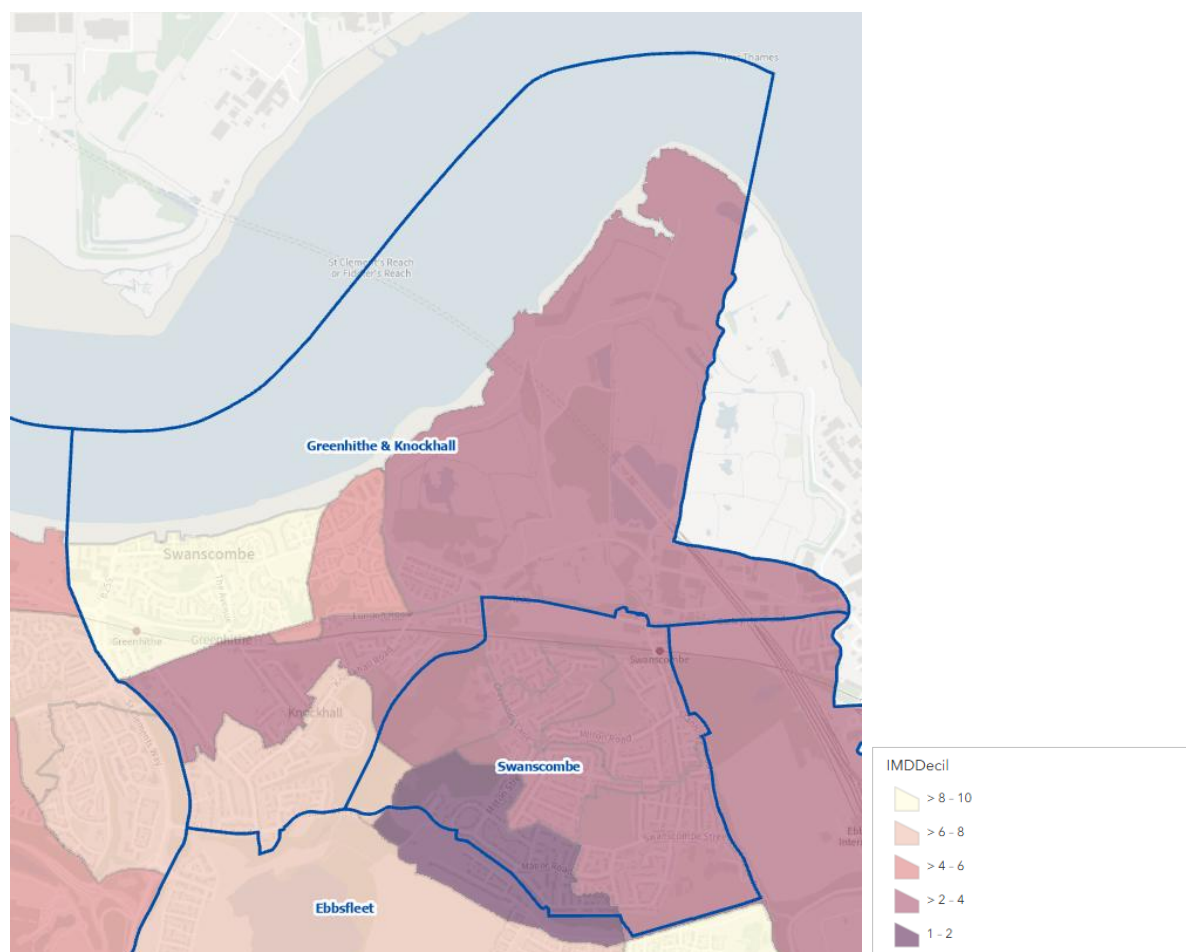
DEPRIVATION

The Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) provides data to a localised scale in terms of the most and least deprived neighbourhoods. In 2025 the updated IMD was published, superseding the 2019 IMD.

Neighbourhoods are called a 'Lower-layer Super Output Area' (LSOA) and have an average population of 1,500 people. In Dartford, there are 67 such neighbourhoods and these do not align with electoral ward boundaries.

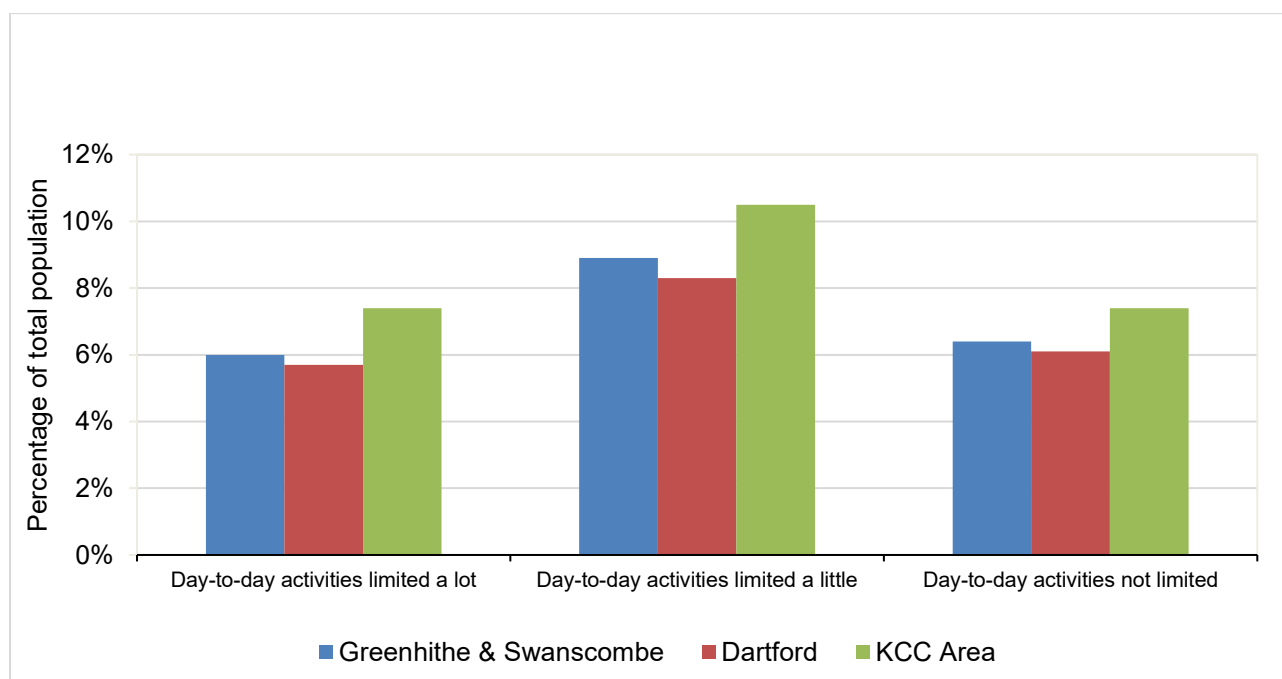
Overall, Greenhithe is within the 70-80% least deprived neighbourhoods nationally. However, much of Swanscombe is 70-90% more deprived than all English neighbourhoods.

Greenhithe & Swanscombe makes up 12.8% of the total employee jobs in the Borough.

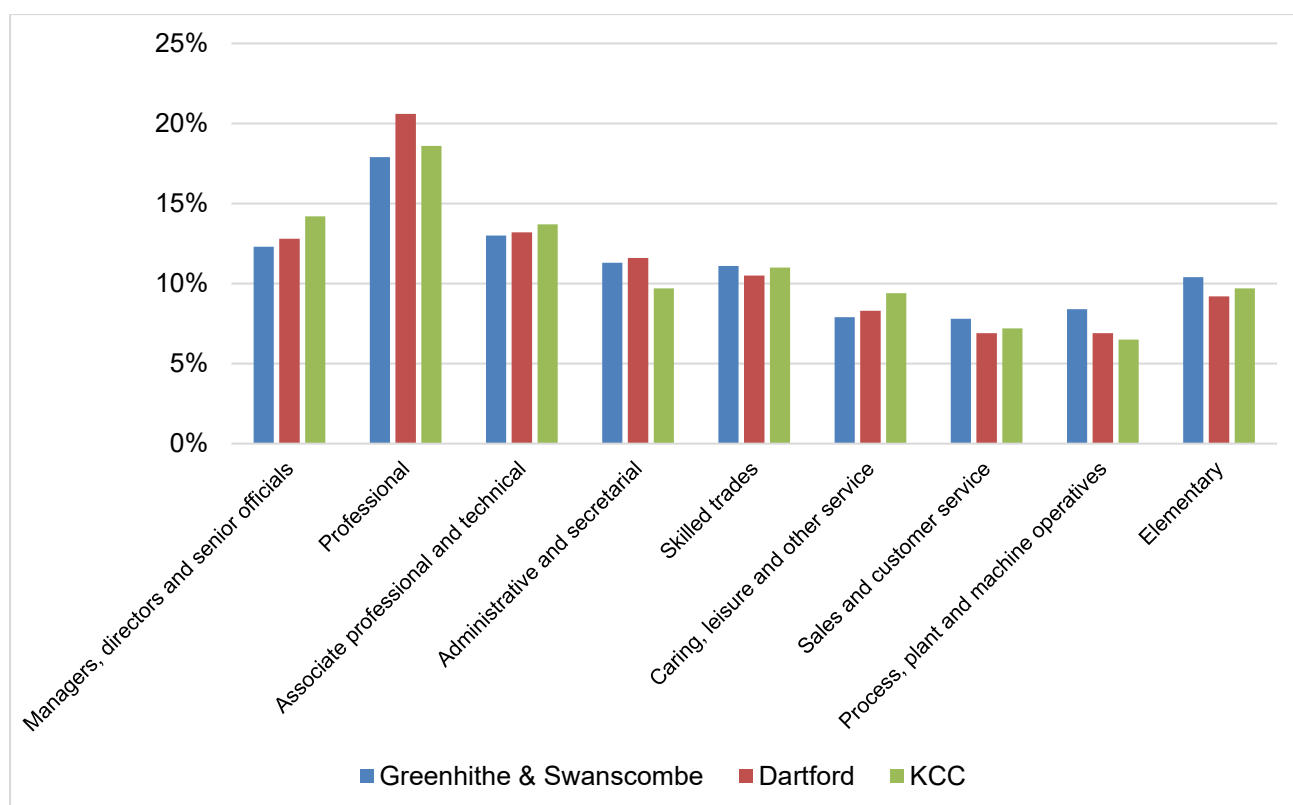

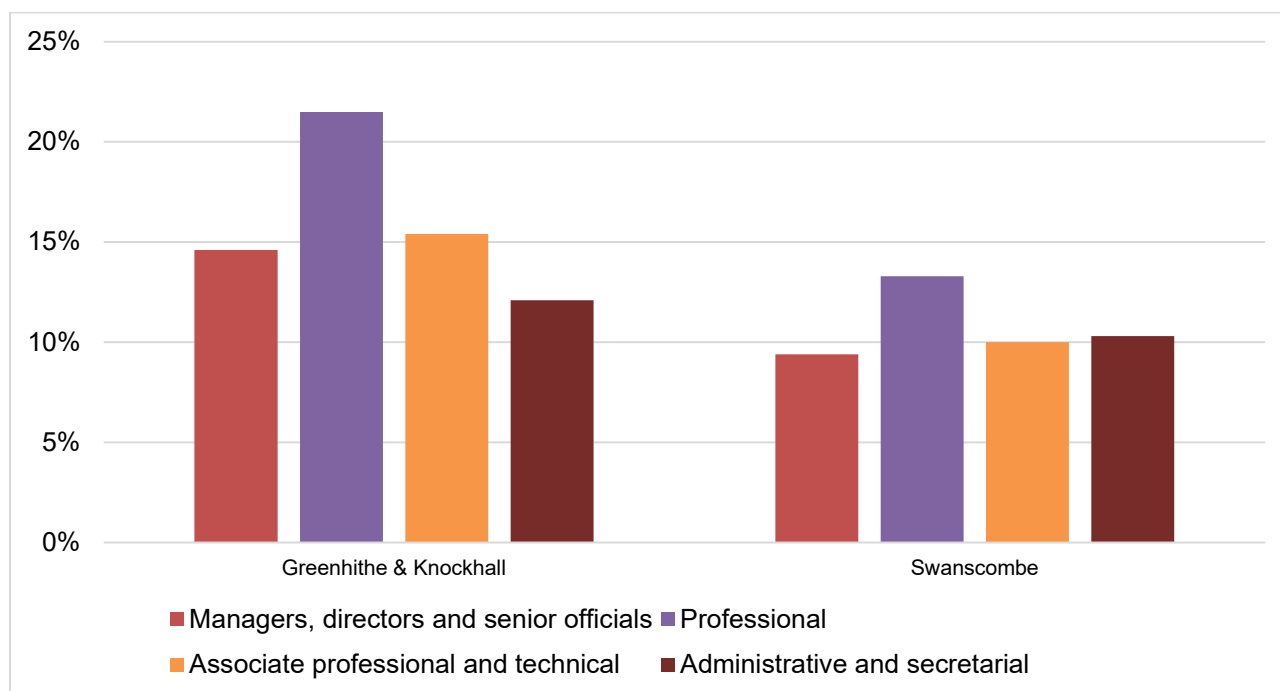

Chart 8: Percentage of residents (aged 16+) by employment occupation, 2021

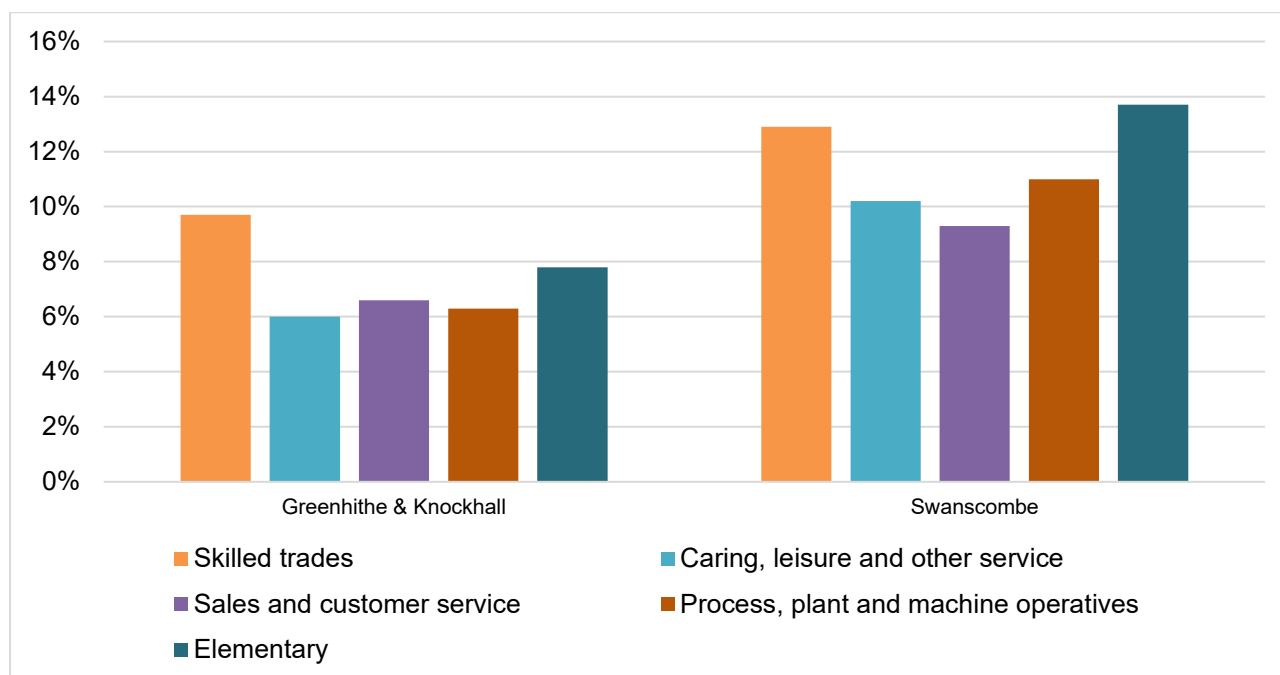

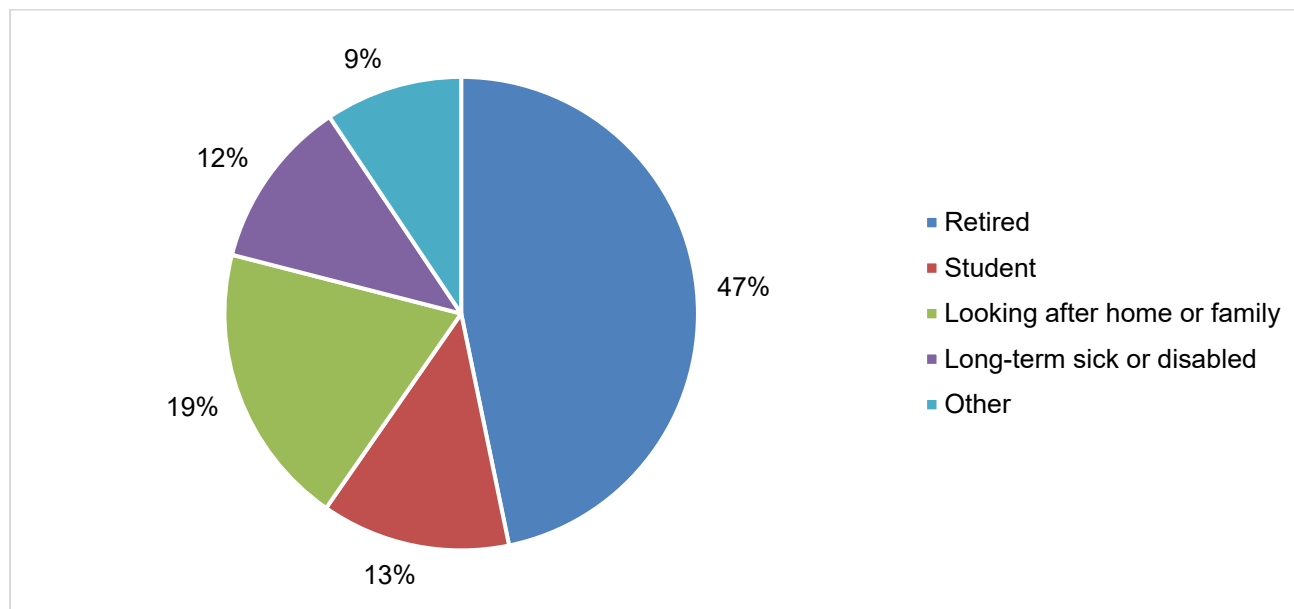
Chart 10: 'Blue collar'/service occupations by ward in Greenhithe & Swanscombe, 2021

UNEMPLOYMENT

Of all usual residents aged 16 years and over in Greenhithe & Swanscombe, 3,300 people (29.4%) were economically inactive in the 2021 Census. The reasons are shown below.

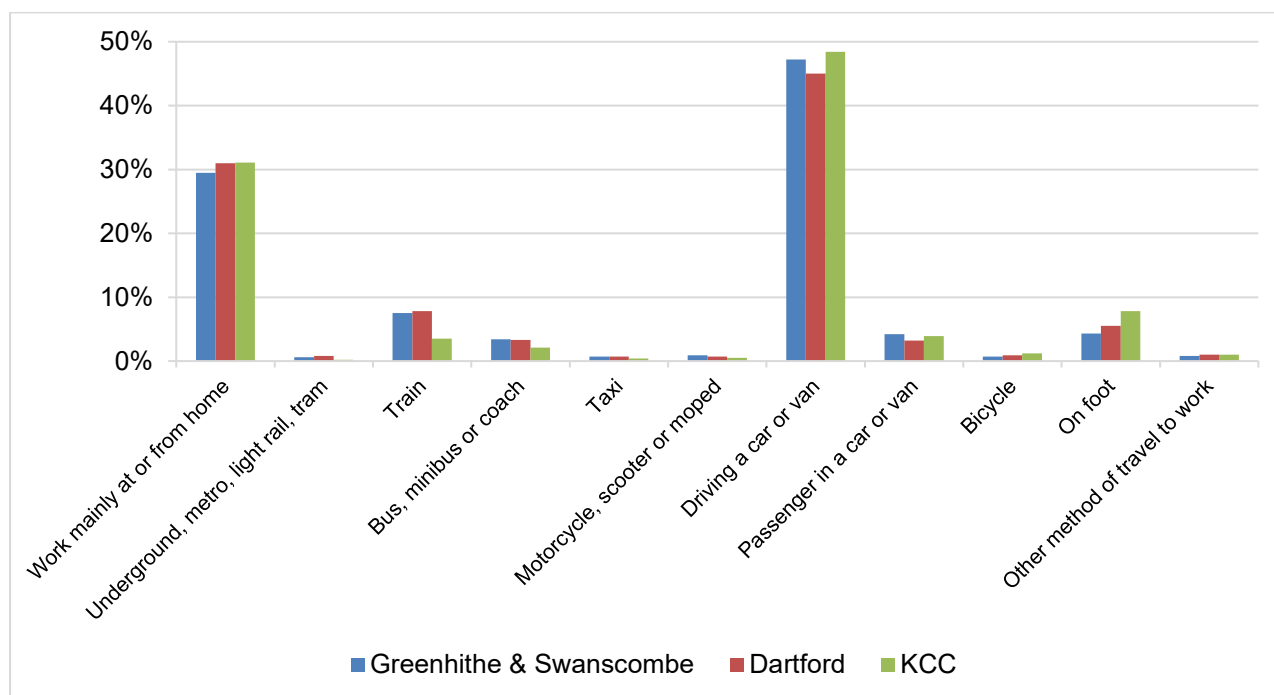

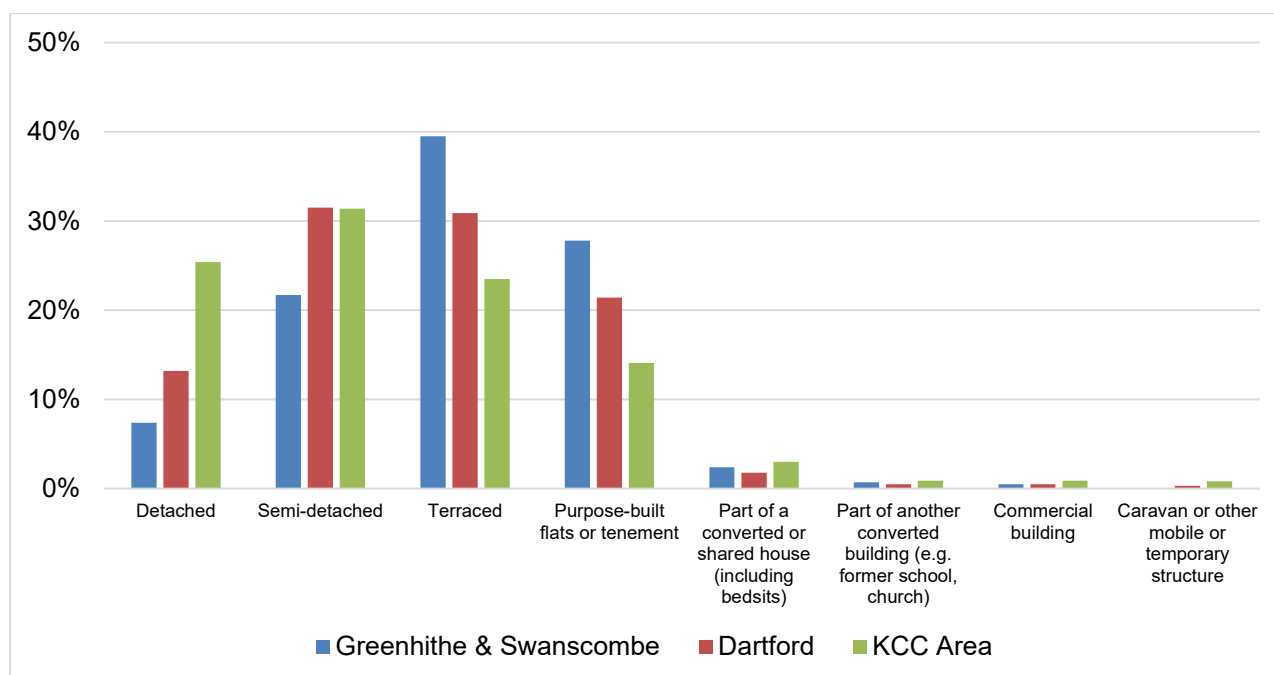
Chart 12: Method of travel to work, 2021

In 2021, there were 5,865 households in Greenhithe & Swanscombe. The types of properties are shown below.

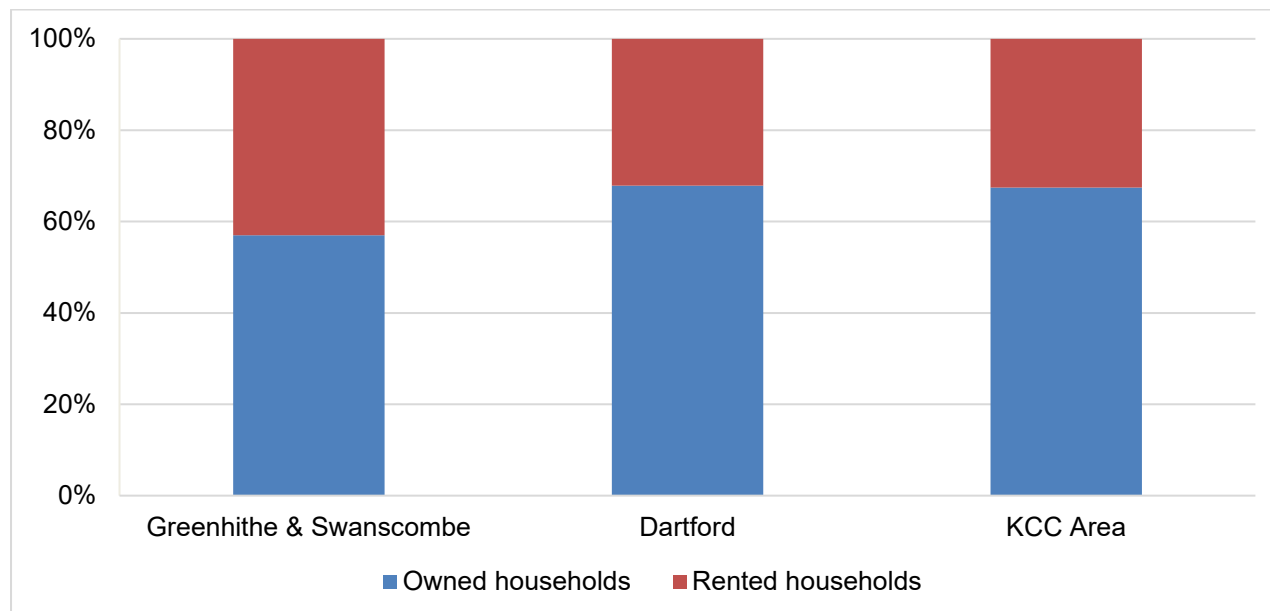
Chart 13: Types of housing, 2021

57% of households in Greenhithe and Swanscombe are owner occupied. Rented households consist of social rented and private rented or living rent free.

HOUSEHOLD SIZE & OCCUPANCY RATING

8.2% of households in Greenhithe and Swanscombe have fewer rooms than required, and 6.3% have fewer bedrooms than required. This implies that those households are overcrowded.

¹ Occupancy rating measures whether a household is overcrowded, ideally occupied or under-occupied. A rating of -1 or less indicates that a household has fewer rooms than required (overcrowded). The number of rooms is taken from Valuation Office Agency (VOA) administrative data.

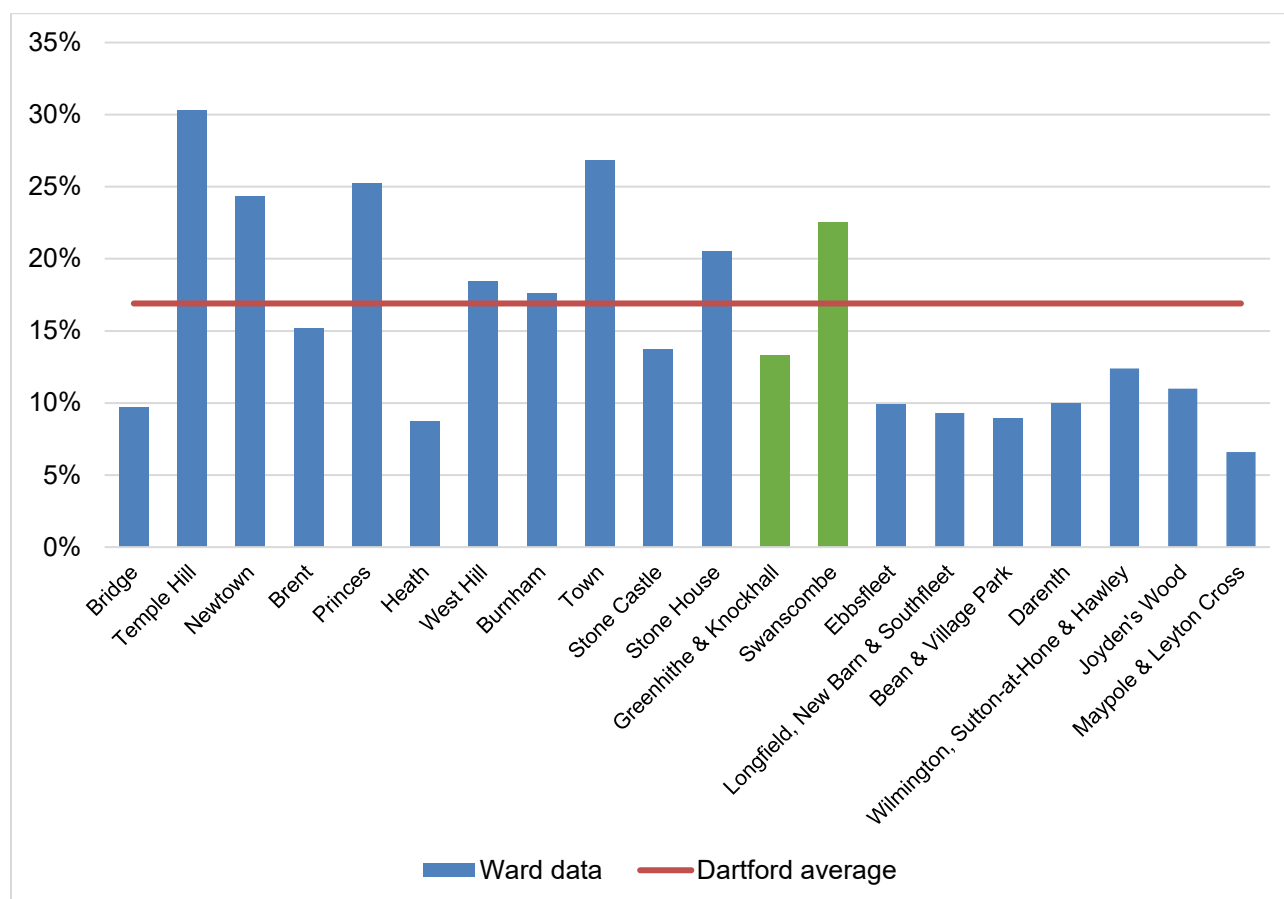

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge on development that allows Dartford Borough Council to raise and pool contributions from developers towards the funding of a wide range of infrastructure. The Council introduced its CIL charging scheme on 1 April 2014.

A limited (nationally set) portion of Dartford's CIL receipts are transferred towards the local neighbourhood level, for appropriate smaller projects. CIL Regulations require that 15% of CIL receipts received from development within a local parish/town council area is transferred by the Council to those parish/town councils

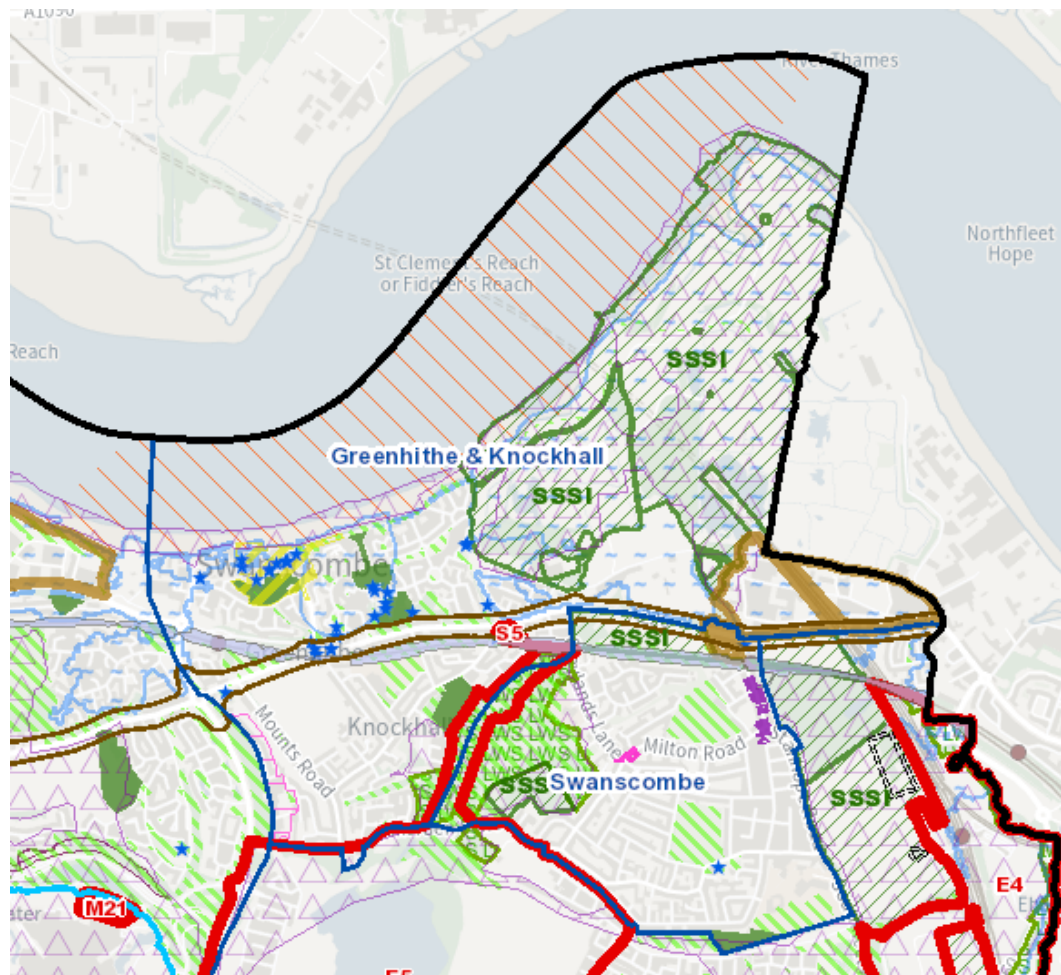
In 2023/24, total CIL receipts amounting to £175,343.31 were transferred to Swanscombe & Greenhithe Town Council.
