INTRODUCTION

This profile summarises a range of population data for the wards of Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross in Dartford Borough.

Both wards partly fall within the area covered by Wilmington Parish Council. Census data specific to the geography of the parish can be found [here](#).

As the ward boundaries changed in 2019, direct comparisons to earlier time periods should not be made.


SUMMARY

- Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross have a population that is older than the Dartford average, with 50% of residents being 50 years or older.
- Higher than average levels of managerial and professional employees living in this area; almost 55% work in these occupations.
- Very low levels of unemployment with an annual average of 1.9%, compared to the Dartford average of 3.1%.
- Semi-detached properties are most common, making up 45% of the housing stock. Detached properties represent 30% and terraced being 18%. Overall, 87.5% of dwellings are owner occupied.
- Relatively high car ownership as only 9.5% of households do not own a car or van.

POPULATION


In 2021, Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross had a population of 8,241 people. This comprised of 3,984 males and 4,257 females, representing a 48.3% and 51.7% split respectively.


Chart 2: Estimated population of Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross, mid-2019 to mid-2024



POPULATION DENSITY

Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross collectively have a population density of 13.7 persons per hectare, compared to the Borough average of 16.1 persons per hectare.




DEPRIVATION

The Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) provides data to a localised scale in terms of the most and least deprived neighbourhoods. In 2025 the updated IMD was published, superseding the 2019 IMD.

Neighbourhoods are called a 'Lower-layer Super Output Area' (LSOA) and have an average population of 1,500 people. In Dartford, there are 67 such neighbourhoods and these do not align with electoral ward boundaries.


Overall, Joyden's Wood is around 90% less deprived than neighbourhoods nationally whilst Maypole & Leyton Cross is 60-80% less deprived than all neighbourhoods.

Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross make up 6.5% of the total employee jobs in the Borough.





Chart 8: Percentage of residents (aged 16+) by employment occupation, 2021




Chart 10: 'Blue collar'/service occupations in Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross, 2021

UNEMPLOYMENT

Of all usual residents aged 16 years and over in Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross, 2,784 people (41.2%) were economically inactive in the 2021 Census. The reasons are presented in the charts below.



Chart 12: Method of travel to work, 2021





Chart 13: Types of housing, 2021



TENURE

87.5% of households in Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross are owner occupied. Rented households consist of social rented and private rented or living rent free.

HOUSEHOLD SIZE & OCCUPANCY RATING

2.4% of households in Joyden's Wood and Maypole & Leyton Cross have fewer rooms than required, and 2% have fewer bedrooms than required. This implies that those households are overcrowded.

¹ Occupancy rating measures whether a household is overcrowded, ideally occupied or under-occupied. A rating of -1 or less indicates that a household has fewer rooms than required (overcrowded). The number of rooms is taken from Valuation Office Agency (VOA) administrative data.




The chart below shows the various levels of car ownership in wards across the Borough against the Dartford average.

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge on development that allows Dartford Borough Council to raise and pool contributions from developers towards the funding of a wide range of infrastructure. The Council introduced its CIL charging scheme on 1 April 2014.

A limited (nationally set) portion of Dartford's CIL receipts are transferred towards the local neighbourhood level, for appropriate smaller projects. CIL Regulations require that 15% of CIL receipts received from development within a local parish/town council area is transferred by the Council to those parish/town councils.


In 2023/24, total CIL receipts amounting to £3,580.37 were transferred to Wilmington Parish Council.
